




Quarter Square Triangles Cutting Chart

The Saudi Arabia flag depicts a white sword and inscription upon a solid green field. The flag's text is the shahada, the Islamic declaration of faith. The text serves as a clear representation of the nation's Islamic heritage, which is further represented by the green field.




The population of Kuwait is 4,369,485. Of this number, roughly 1.45 million are Kuwaiti citizens. The remaining are foreign nationals that come from over 120 different countries, with Indians forming the largest community, followed by Egyptians and then Filipinos.

Kuwait has no renewable freshwater resources
Kuwait has no lakes or rivers, and therefore, the major source
of water in Kuwait is the sea, with Kuwait's drinking water
supply coming mainly from saltwater desalination plants.
These desalination plants are the primary source of fresh
water for drinking purposes. They provide 92 percent of water,
which equates to about 60 percent of the total water supply.

The Kuwaiti flag is full of meaning.

The Kuwaiti flag features horizontal stripes of green, white, and red with a black truncated triangle. A poem by the Arabic poet Ṣafī ad-Dīn al-Ḥill inspired the colors of the flag of Kuwait. In his fakhr ("boasting") poem – written in the 13th century – he wrote: "White are our deeds, black are our battles, / Green are our tents, red are our swords." Officials first used this version of the Kuwaiti flag on the 24th of October 1961.
