Materials Requirements

Assorted Halloween Prints

- 10 fat quarters

White Solid (A)

- 1 fat quarter

Blue Solid (B)

- 1 fat quarter

Black Solid (C)

- 1 fat quarter

Grey Solid (D)

- 1 fat quarter

Orange Solid (E)

- 1 fat quarter

Orange Print (F)

- 1 fat quarter

Backing

- 4 yards

Batting

- 3 yards

General Notes

- The finished size is 30" X 42"
- WOF = Width of Fabric
- All seams are sewn with a ¼ inch unless specified
- Print paper piecing templates on letter size (8½" x 11") making sure to print on actual size or 100%

Cut Your Fabric

Assorted Halloween Prints or Solids

- 1 rectangle 6½" x 12½"
- 24 squares 6½"
- 1 square 12½"

Backing

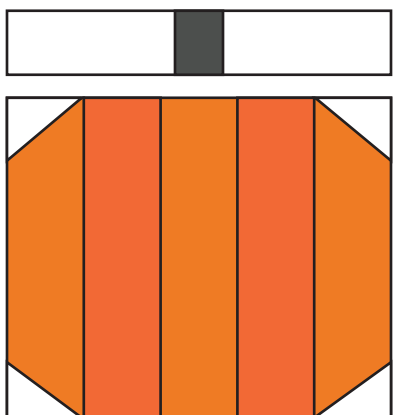
- 2 rectangles 30½" x 42½"
- 5 rectangles 30½" x 6½"
- 2 rectangles 18½" x 6½"
- 1 square 12½" x 12½"

Batting

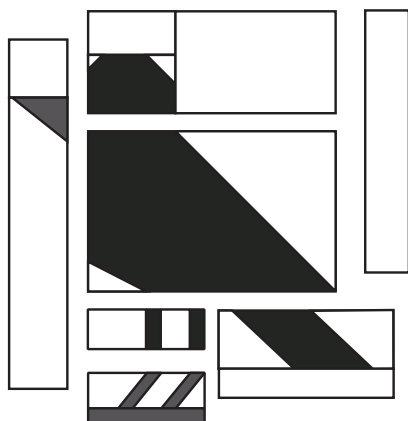
- 1 rectangle 30½" x 42½"

Paper Piece the Blocks

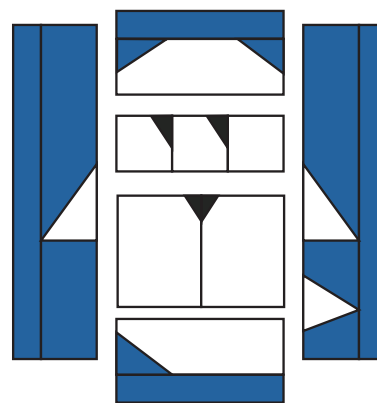
- 1 Use foundation paper piecing with the templates and assemble the pieces together using the diagrams below.



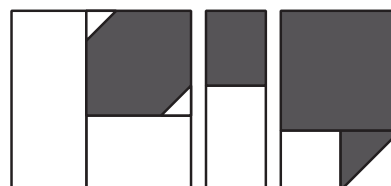
Pumpkin

- 2 Sew the fabric squares and blocks into rows but keep the rows separate.



- 3 Attach batting directly onto your frame. Lay the strips onto the batting and quilt one row at a time. You can use the quilting designs that come with the Quilter's Creative Touch October 2023 Gold Access subscription, or trace the designs included at the end of this pattern with a laser stylus.



- 4 Cut each row of the quilt out of the batting
- 5 For each row, layer a piece of backing the same size as the section, right-sides together
- 6 Sew all along the edge of one of the quilt sections closing off all four sides
- 7 Cut a hole in the backing and trim off all for corners



- 8 Pull the sandwich right-side-out through the hole and use a pencil to push the corners out
- 9 Cut a piece of iron-on adhesive at least ¼” wider on all side of the piece you cut out of the backing
- 10 Slip the piece of iron-on adhesive in the hole and iron it onto the batting.
- 11 Remove the paper from the iron-on adhesive, place the piece of backing you cut out over the hole and press the opening closed

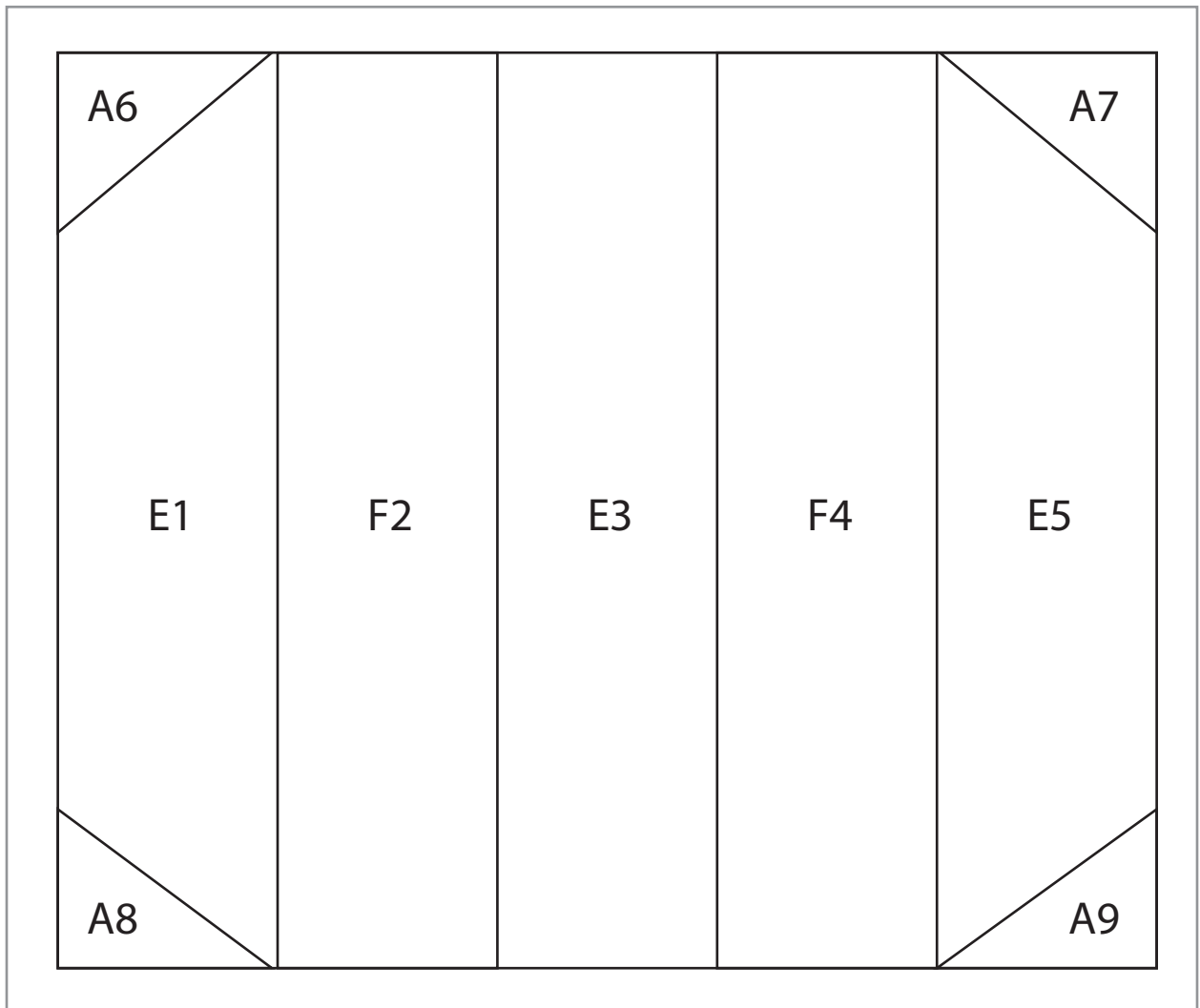
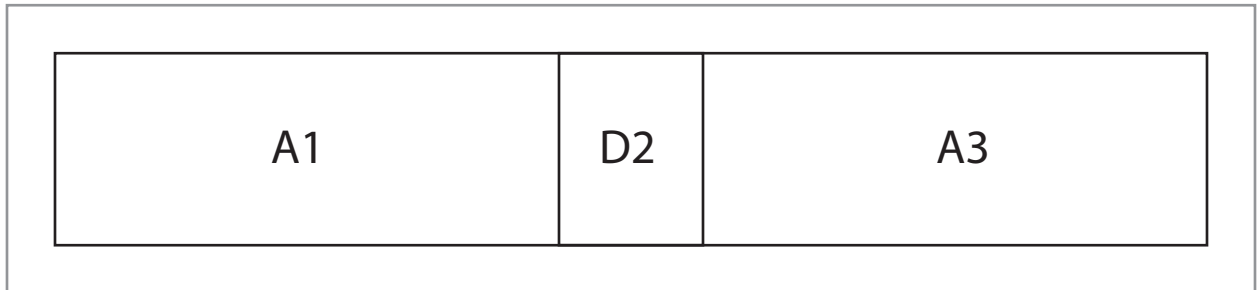


- 12 Repeat steps 6-11 for each quilt section
- 13 To make the back of the project, layer your 2 rectangles of backing 30½” x 42½” right-sides together and place on the same size piece of batting
- 14 Follow steps 6-11 with the backing layer

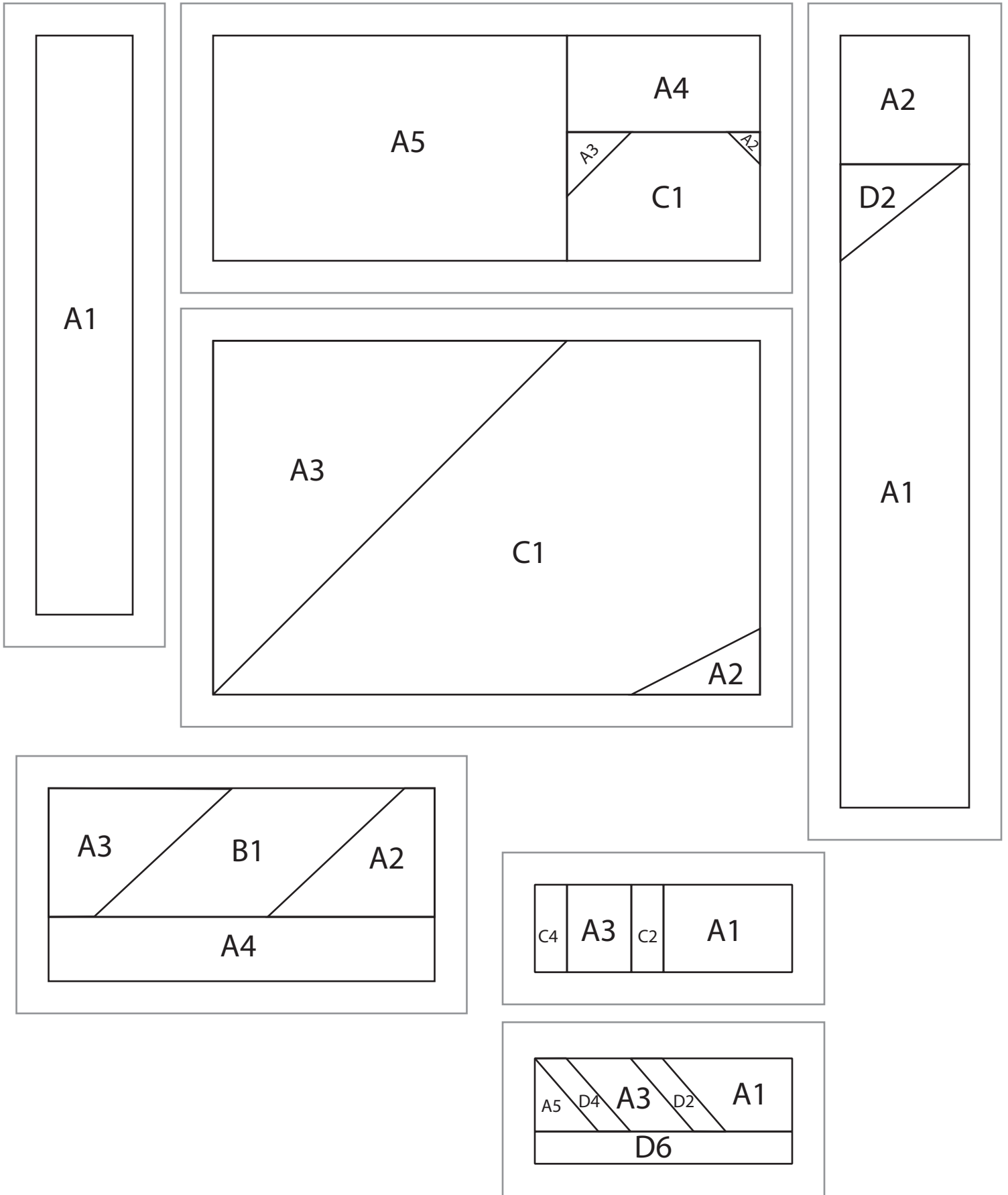
- 15 Pin all of the quilt sections to backing layer starting at the bottom and working to the top, overlapping the sections slightly on the top edge
- 16 Fold over excess fabric at the top and tack down the edge to create a loop you can push a pole through
- 17 Starting in the top right corner, top stitch along the right, bottom and left seams of all of the blocks. Leave the top edge of each section open to create the pockets.



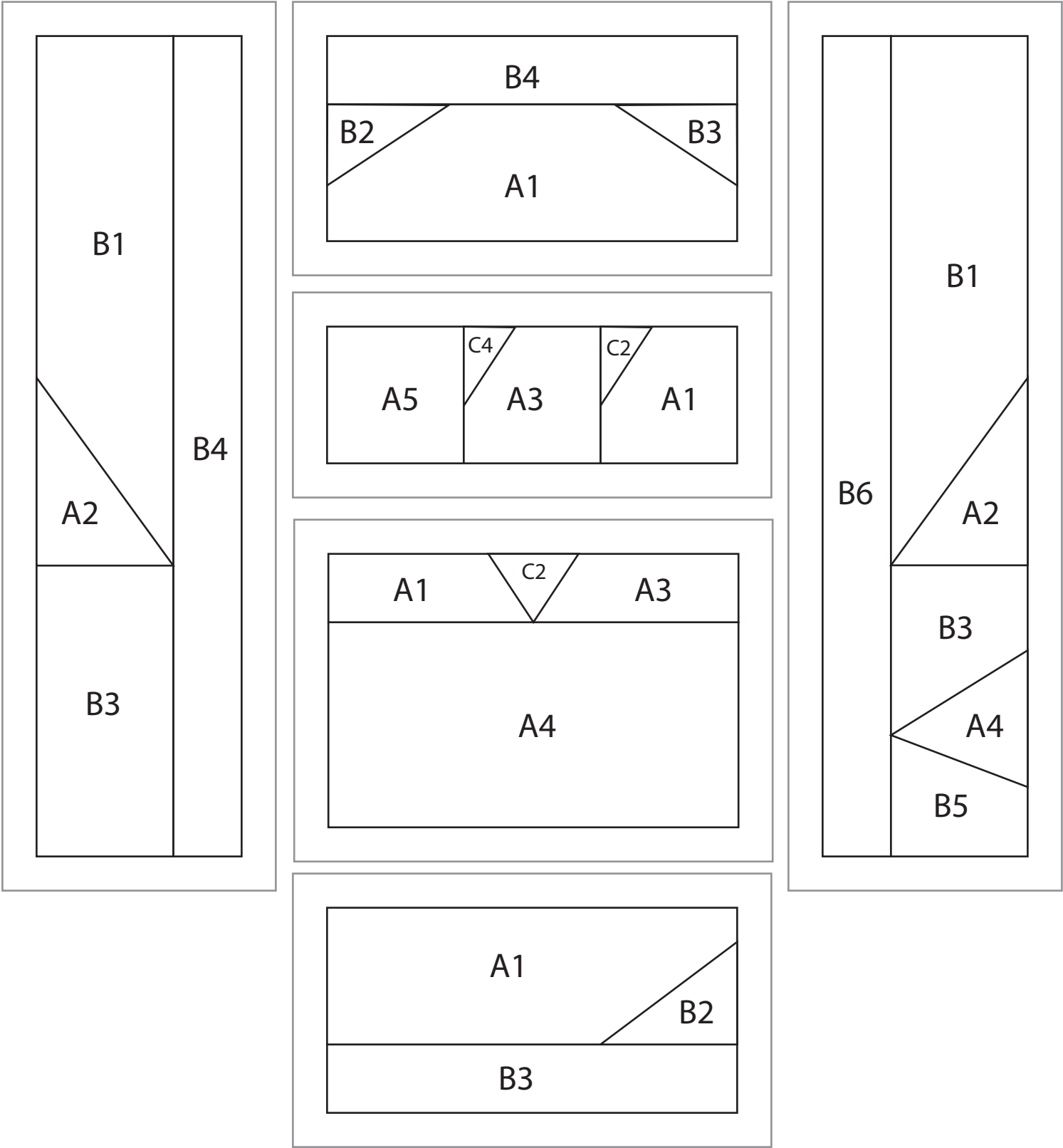
Pumpkin Template
