

# Baby Bubbles Jacket





## Materials Requirements

A pattern for a jacket

Small squares and rectangles sewn into strips. The strips need to be longer than the width of the widest piece of the pattern. For my 2T jacket I used strips about 18" long and 3" wide.

Batting - Enough to fit all the pieces of your pattern

Stuffing

Thread

Marker or chalk pencil

Accessories to complete the jacket pattern such as zippers,

## General Notes

- The finished size is 54" X 72"
- WOF = Width of Fabric
- All seams are sewn with a ¼ inch unless specified
- Print paper piecing templates on letter size (8½" x 11") making sure to print on actual size or 100%



These instructions will show you how to take a pattern you already have and use the baby bubbles technique to create a unique puffy jacket.

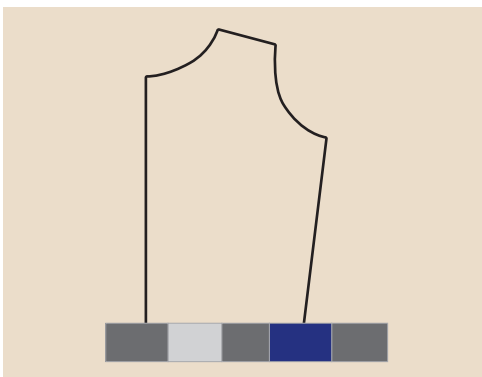
## Creating a Baby Bubbles Jacket

1 Attach batting directly to your frame

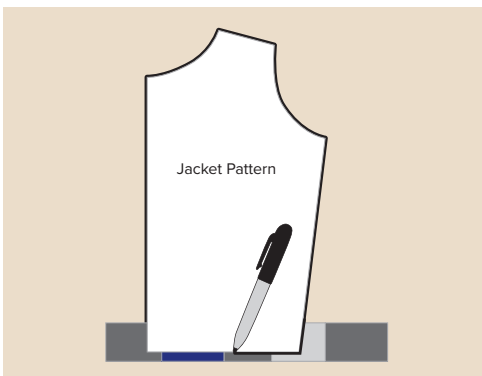
2 Trace a section of your jacket pattern onto your batting



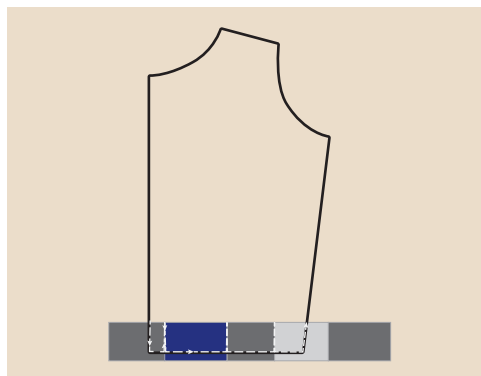
3 Lay a strip over the bottom of your markings



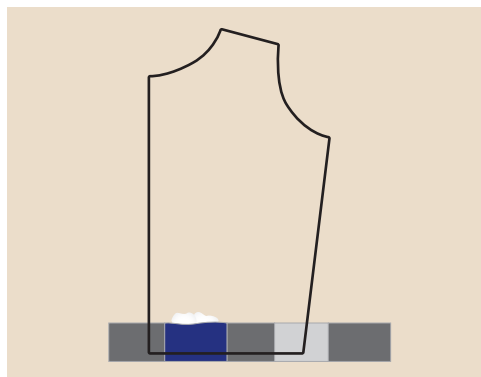
4 Place the same piece of your pattern over the section you traced and redraw the section that was covered by the strip



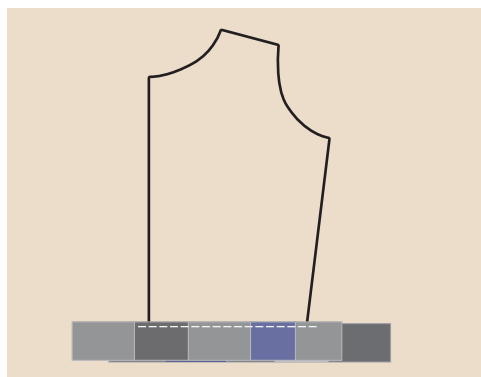
5 Stitch along the markings on the strip and along all of the seams



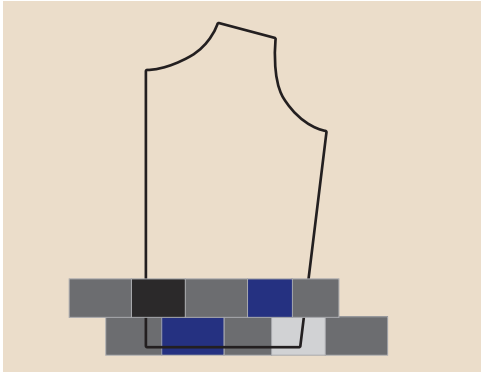
6 Use stuffing to stuff all of the pockets



7 Lay the next strip right-side down, over the previous strip and stitch along the top edge



- 8** Flip the strip up and repeat steps 4-8 until the entire area is covered



- 9** Repeat steps 2-8 for all the sections of your pattern. Then cut out the sections from the batting and sew the pieces together using the instructions for the pattern
