


Starberries







Materials Requirements

- Assorted Red and Pink Color Solids
- Yellow Green Solid
- Green Solids
- White Background
- Blue Background
- Gray Background
- Backing
- Batting

- 5 different 1/2 yard pieces
- 1 fat quarter or 4 scrap pieces
- 5 fat quarters or 150 scrap pieces
- 3 yards
- 3 yards
- 1 yard
- 4 yards
- 4 yards

General Notes

- The finished size is 54'" X 72"
- WOF = Width of Fabric
- All seams are sewn with a 1/4 inch unless specified
- Print paper piecing templates on letter size (8.5" X 11") making sure to print on actual size or 100%

Cut Your Fabric

- Strawberry fabrics
 (96) 2" x 2 1/2" squares
 (24) 6" X 4"rectangles
 (5) 8 1/4" squares
- Strawberry Green fabrics (150) 2" x 2 1/2" squares
- Strawberry Yellow Green Fabric
 - (4) 2" x 2 1/2" squares
 - (1) 6 X 4"rectangle "
 - (1) 8 1/4"square
- White Background

 (10) 6" X 5"rectangle
 (6) 6" X 9" rectangle
 (16) 4" X 5 1/2" rectangle
 (64) 4 1/2 X 10 1/2" rectangle
 (175) 2" X 2" squares
 (100) 4 3/8" squares
- Blue Background
 (66) 7" x 5 1/2" squares
- Gray Background
 (6) 7 X 5 1/2" Squares

Cutting General Notes

- For more variety, vary the colors of the strawberry tops and strawberry bodies
- Scraps can be used
- 25 finished Strawberry blocks
- 10 half size white background blocks
- 6 full size white background blocks
- 28 white and blue blocks
- 2 blue, gray and white blocks
- 2 gray and white blocks
- 8 half size blue and white blocks

Paper Piecing Instructions

- Start by printing out your templates at actual size. Make all of your copies from the same original and the same machine. Trim down all templates leaving 1/4" on all sides. Do NOT trim on the line
- The lines on the template indicate where to sew and the numbers indicate which order in which to sew. The seam allowances that are shown are the ones that go around the template. The lines and nu,ners are printed on the front of the pattern. This is the side to sew on. The back of the pattern is blank. This is where the fabric will be placed.
- 2 Place a strawberry green 2" X 2 1/2" rectangle right side up on the blank side of the pattern covering section A1. Make sure your fabric the fabric extends beyond the lines at least 1/4".
- **3** Place a white 2"X 2" Square over the green square right sides together. Look through the paper at a light souce. Make sure both pieces are covering the seam line.
- **4** Sew along the line. Fold the paper back. Trim the excess fabric down to 1/4". Then press white square open
- 5 Place white square over A1 and A2 right sides together. Look through the paper at a light souce. Make sure both pieces are covering the seam line.
- 6 Sew along seam line. Fold back paper and trim to 1/4"
- 7 Continue until you have covered all sections in ordered number
- 8 Trim Pieces leaving the included 1/4" seam allowance
- 9 Repeat Pocess for B1 B9, C1- C4, and D1- D3

No Waste Flying Geese

- 1 Gather (1) 8 1/4" and (4) 4 3/8" squares
- 2 Draw a line from one corner to the opposite corner on the wrong side of the fabric.
- 3 Place two of the small squares on the large square right sides together and the small squares in opposite corners. The lines on the small squares should line up
- 4 Make sure all the fabrics are aligned and pin together
- **5** Sew two seams each a 1/4" away from the marked line.
- 6 Cut in half along the drawn line. Press seams
- 7 Take one half of the square and place a small square in the corner of each half right sides together.
- 8 Sew two seams 1/4" away from the marked line. Cut apart at the drawn line
- **9** Press triangles open to create four flying geese.
- **10** Trim the tiny traingles that form on the seam allowances.
- **11** Repeat to make all flying geese needed. (You will have extra using this method)

Assembly of blocks


- 1 To assemble strawberries gather all paper pieced tops, flying geese, and 6" X 4" rectangles
- Take the paper off the back of the strawberry top pieces. Pin and sew together.
- Sew the rectangle to the flying geese.
- Press all seams.
- Pin the top pieces to the bottom of the strawberry.
- Sew and Press seams
- 2 To assemble multicolored background block

- Take paper off of the paper pieced halves of the block
- Line up the colored points in the center of the block. right sides together
- Pin and Sew
- Press Seams
- Trim triangles that form in the corners at the seam allowance

Layout Instructions

- Lay out the quilt as shown in the diagram on the following page or as desired
- If making a lap size quilt replace tall white background blocks with strawberries
- Sew blocks into rows
- Pin and Press seams
- Repeat until the top is assembled
